### A little about UNICEF Australia

- Founded in 1966, we're part of UNICEF, which was set up just after World War II to help children at risk
- We're on the ground in 190 countries and territories worldwide
- We work day-in and day-out in some of the world's most disadvantaged places
- We advocate for children by influencing policy and guiding decision makers
- Our work is varied and far-reaching and includes delivering clean water, better nutrition, life-saving healthcare, long-term education, emergency response... Whatever is needed, wherever it's needed

### What we've achieved around the world

- We've provided 447 million children with vitamin A supplements in the past two years, reducing blindness in children, boosting their immunity to disease and reducing child deaths
- We helped immunise more than 85 million children against measles in 2016
- We reached 33,000 children in South Sudan with life-saving supplies and support
- By 2016 we'd treated almost half the world's children under 5 with life-saving vaccines
- Over the past 3 years we've helped bring safe water to over 49 million people enduring crisis and conflict
- We've delivered basic education to 11.7 million children in humanitarian situations since 2016
- We've ensured 2.6 billion more people now have cleaner drinking water today than in 1990
