

## FAQs for GoodWILL Champions

#### What constitutes a simple Will?

The Good*WILL* Project.

We see our role as connecting GoodWILL Champions with clients who want to leave a gift in their Will to UNICEF Australia. For that reason, GoodWILL Champions will have some discretion in deciding what they think constitutes a 'simple Will' for the purposes of the project.

We would expect you to consider a Will to be 'simple' if it did no more than distribute assets to identified beneficiaries and appoint guardians for children - beyond that, you are free to decide whether a particular Will is simple based on the facts at hand.

# What if someone comes to me and their Will isn't simple?

GoodWILL Champions are under no obligation to prepare Wills as a part of the project if they are not simple. However, if someone comes to you with a Will that isn't simple you may decide to either:

- Agree to prepare it for free as a part of the project, not withstanding its relative complexity; or
- In the spirit of the project, talk to the prospective client about a reduced fee arrangement.

We would encourage you to have a preliminary conversation with all prospective clients to determine whether you consider their will to be simple - if not, best to let them know early on!

Our role in this project is limited to connecting GoodWILL Champions with clients who want to leave a bequest to UNICEF. We do not accept any liability for any work undertaken as a part of this project and all work undertaken must fall within the existing insurance arrangements for GoodWILL Champion firms and lawyers.
